## INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS FOR OWN EMPLOYEES, SUPPLIERS, CUSTOMERS AND CUSTOMERS SUPPLIERS.

Regarding the situation with Coronavirus / COVID-19, it is a requirement that all employees, customers, suppliers and customers' suppliers show extended responsibility - both in relation to themselves, colleagues and the other surroundings. This is done, for example, by following the Danish authorities' instructions. These can be read in both Danish and English at [www.sst.dk/corona](http://www.sst.dk/corona).

### The 5 recommendations from the authorities are:

- Wash your hands frequently or sanitize your hands with an alcohol-based hand rub
- Cough or sneeze into your sleeve, not your hands
- Limit physical contact – avoid handshakes, refuse kisses on the cheek and avoid hugging
- Be diligent with cleaning – both at home and in your workplace
- Keep your distance and ask others to be considerate

### Foreign superintendents and business travelers

Foreign superintendents, representatives and business travelers can enter Denmark and Orskov Yard by having a worthy purpose. An invitation letter can be forwarded on request.

### Seafarers

Shore leave for foreign seafarers is now allowed by the authorities. This ONLY applies to ships in dock or at the quay and NOT ships on the water. Seafarers, who are Danish citizens or are residing in Denmark may go ashore. Crew change is allowed, as it is deemed a worthy purpose.

**Orskov Yard strongly recommend foreign seafarers not to go ashore when they are on the yard area.**

If you have symptoms, please contact medical services and do not enter Orskov Yard before you have a negative corona test.
