INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS FOR OWN EMPLOYEES, SUPPLIERS, CUSTOMERS AND CUSTOMERS' SUPPLIERS

Regarding the situation with Corona virus / COVID-19, it is a requirement that all employees, customers, suppliers and customers' suppliers show extended responsibility - both in relation to themselves, colleagues and the other surroundings. This is done, for example, by following the Danish authorities' instructions. These can be read in both Danish and English at www.sst.dk/corona.

The 5 recommendations from the authorities are:

- Wash your hands frequently or sanitize your hands with an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Cough or sneeze into your sleeve, not your hands.
- Limit physical contact – avoid handshakes, refuse kisses on the cheek and avoid hugging.
- Be diligent with cleaning – both at home and in your workplace.
- Keep your distance and ask others to be considerate.

In addition, Orskov Yard has introduced that, face masks must be worn:

- When driving in trucks with more than one person.
- In the common canteen.
- In the administration building on South dept., and the master's office on North dept.
- During ALL meetings on Orskov Yard.

We also refer to the fact that face masks and gloves are used as much as possible when you are in the yard's areas.

Entry restrictions to Denmark:

Foreign inspectors, business travelers and migrant labor

For all foreign inspectors, representatives, business travelers and migrant workers entering from abroad to Orskov Yard with a recognizable purpose, a negative COVID-19 test - performed a maximum of 24 hours before the time of entry - must be presented.

Crew

According to the authorities, foreign seafarers who enter Denmark with a recognizable purpose have land permits in Danish ports. However, you must be able to present a negative Coronatest - taken no later than 24 hours - before going ashore.

Orskov Yard strongly recommends that the crew members do not go ashore when they are in the yard's areas and that they do not have contact with the yard's employees and suppliers.

Orskov Yard requires that all crews arriving at the yard must have taken a corona test NO LATER THAN 24 hours after arrival. All crew members must also be tested at least once a week during shipyard stays at Orskov Yard.

Requirements for testing and isolation after entry into Denmark

In order to limit the introduction and spread of more contagious virus variants, the Danish authorities have introduced requirements for testing and isolation for 10 days in connection with entry into Denmark. However, there is no requirement for isolation for travelers from yellow countries.

However, foreign workers, including maritime technicians and business travelers, can break the isolation while, for example, performing their work or providing services. Outside working hours, they must remain in isolation. The isolation period can be interrupted completely if they receive a negative response to a PCR test taken no earlier than the 4th day after entry.

Vaccination

For the time being, foreign customers, suppliers and employees must follow the rules described above for entry into Denmark even if they have been fully vaccinated. For fully vaccinated Danish and local customers, suppliers and employees, Orskov Yard strongly recommends continuing to be tested regularly when entering the yard's areas.

Suspicion of Corona infection

If infection with the corona virus is suspected, a negative test must be shown before access to Orskov Yard's area can be allowed.

Previously infected with Corona

People who have previously been infected with Corona must present evidence of a positive Corona test result that is at least 14 days and at most 12 weeks old.
